Ambedkar Study Circle

During the academic session 2025–26, the Ambedkar Study Circle of Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College organized a series of activities to promote social awareness and engagement with constitutional values. These initiatives reflected the ideals and vision of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar encouraged students to reflect on issues of equality, justice, and social responsibility.

As part of its efforts to promote social awareness, the society organized a screening of the film *Article 15* on 15 April 2025 in Seminar Hall 1. The event was attended by 72 undergraduate students, reflecting enthusiastic participation and interest in socially relevant issues. The film effectively highlighted the realities of caste-based discrimination and emphasized the significance of constitutional values such as equality, justice, and human dignity. The screening also resonated with Dr. B. R. Ambedkar’s ideals and vision, encouraging participants to reflect on their role in promoting social justice and inclusivity.

On the same day, an Essay Writing Competition was successfully organized under the aegis of IQAC on the college campus. The event was centered on the theme “*Ambedkar’s Economic Vision for India*.” The competition aimed to encourage students to critically engage with Dr. Ambedkar’s economic ideas and understand their relevance in contemporary India. It provided a platform for students to express their views on issues such as economic justice, social equality, and inclusive development.

On 25 September 2025, the Ambedkar Study Circle organized a thought-provoking seminar titled “*Breaking Barriers, Building the Nation*,” reflecting on Dr. Ambedkar’s enduring contributions to social equality and national progress. Shri Abhishek Swami (IRAS), the Chief Guest, delivered an engaging and insightful address highlighting Dr. Ambedkar’s vision of constitutional morality, social justice, and inclusive nation-building. He discussed the contemporary relevance of Ambedkar’s ideas, particularly the need to eliminate structural barriers and strengthen democratic values. His analysis encouraged students to reflect on their role in fostering an equitable society.

On the occasion of Constitution Day, the Ambedkar Study Circle, in collaboration with Republica, organized a seminar on “*Indian Constitutionalism and Social Movements*” on 26 November 2025. The speaker, Prof. Ujjwal Kumar Singh, Senior Professor, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi, shared valuable insights into the role of the Indian Constitution in shaping rights and justice, while highlighting its relevance to contemporary social movements. The seminar was attended by 114 students.

Through these activities, the Ambedkar Study Circle continued to create awareness and encourage meaningful engagement with social and constitutional issues among students.
