#### WEBINAR ON "HISTORY OF WOMEN'S MOVEMENTS IN INDIA"

On 24th October 2020, Nimbus conducted a comprehensive webinar with Dr. Indu Agnihotri, eminent academician and activist, Ex-Director, Centre for Women's Development Studies on the "History of Women's Movements in India." The session turned out to be a huge success, as it welcomed a massive turnout from students and faculty alike, who were soon immersed in the light of knowledge shared by our esteemed speaker and were enthusiastically participating by asking questions. Dr. Agnihotri conducted the webinar in an orderly fashion, guiding the listeners through a variety of historical campaigns, from colonial to contemporary, in which women played a significant role. She talked about gender discrimination, sexism, violence against women and women's rights as well. She educated us on the fact that we owe a great deal to our forefathers and mothers. Making a strong distinction between resistance and movement, she emphasised how, in contrast to resistance, movement is an orchestrated and deliberate act of directional activism, encompassing deputations and a plethora of administrative work. She also discussed the numerous Samitis and National organisations that emerged following 1917. Towards the end of the session, the covid pandemic and its impact on women's lives was also explored. How the Covid crisis made the helplessness of women more evident, be it migrant workers or house helps or Asha didis who are front line workers in the pandemic. Dr. Agnihotri concluded her speech by asserting how this inequality is an individual, political and social issue. The session was pertinent, for it was a small step towards learning, understanding, and appreciating the women of India, their arduous journey towards self-realization and empowerment. The session might have only lasted for an hour yet, but it was a significant and extremely important session for everyone present in order to further understand and honour the women of India who played a key role in driving the nation to its current reality.


