Course Objective:

The course studies the most dramatic years in the history of the USSR .i.e. the period between 1945 to 1991. During these years the Soviet Union acquired the status of a super-power. The ex- tent of major economic and political changes between 1956 and 1991 will be examined. Students will also study the origins of the Cold War and Khrushchev's foreign policy and relations with Eastern European and other socialist countries. The students will be acquainted with trends in literature and culture during this period. The reforms of the Gorbachov era and the question of nuclear disarmament will provide some of the contexts for the study of the larger [global] pro-cesses that led to the dissolution of the Soviet Union.

- Outline and explain key developments in the history of the USSR between 1945 and 1991.
- Critically analyse the Soviet political system and its global impact
- Co-relate the various developments to culture and literary growth.

- Analyse the factors leading to economic slowdown, disintegration of the Soviet Union and the formation of Confederation of Independent States.
